On Saturday 22 March the Parua Bay Weed Action Group sprang into existence, thanks to the enthusiastic folks who came to the Community Centre carpark for a discussion about how we can help the reserves and other public spaces around Parua Bay.

There was a lot of great local knowledge and ideas shared. Following this, we spent an hour and a half practising our techniques on the weedy plants around the carpark. While this is not our usual native bush environment, it provided easy access to example species such as cotoneaster, tree privet, Chinese privet, moth plant, and woolly nightshade.

Moth Plant Pod Bin

Keep those pods coming! The first pod bin at the Parua Bay Community Centre took 6 weeks to fill up, which is slower going than recent years. The second bin will be in place until full. Planting Prep Underway - Reotahi & McLeod Bay

In early March Weed Action's Mike and Kate spent a morning spraying back the kikuyu at selected sites at Reotahi and McLeod Bay, in preparation for planting natives in June.

Weed Action groups have done small amounts of planting over the years but this year, in keeping with our focus on the whole picture of habitat restoration, we are planning to get 600+ seedlings into the ground across these sites.

We are only able to do this with the support of so many individuals and organisations - motivation, planting plans and seed-raising from trust member James Bellamy, advice and extra seedlings from Bream Head/Te Whara Conservation Trust, some contractor spray work and approval from Whangarei District Council, and the loan of the gun and hose for spraying thanks to Kelly Maxwell and Native Forest Restoration Trust!

Smugglers Track Crew Report

On an already humid March Sunday morning, the Smugglers Track Crew set off for Home Bay, determined to pull out more moth plant roots and collect the pods. There are several nooks and crannies not visible from the track where this rampant vine has been hiding. Hundreds of vines were pulled or cut and treated with [Cut 'n' Paste Met Gel](#) and a full black rubbish sack of pods was collected in the 2.5 hour session.

A huge thanks to the team who came and sweated it out that morning - perhaps lucky for us all we didn't get a pic together!

Container Returns

Have you previously received free herbicides from us? We are calling for any empty containers to be returned so we can wash and use them again!

A bin with secure lid has been placed beside the moth plant pod bin at the Parua Bay Community Centre at 1347 Whangārei Heads Road. Into this you can put:

- Empty 500ml white jerry cans
- Empty 250ml red lidded pottles
- Empty Cut n Paste bottles
- Please ensure the lid is on in case there are residual amounts of herbicide.

Elaeagnus and Cotoneaster

While we have felt like a very moth plant focused organisation for the last couple of months, rest assured we are not letting all those other invasive weeds fly under the radar. A couple of hardy hedge type weeds that do manage to keep themselves...

I dual! A couple of many hedge type weeds that do manage to keep themselves hidden until they're suddenly a huge problem are cotoneaster and elaeagnus.

Now is a great time to spot cotoneaster, with its bright red berries on display. Even if you can't pronounce it, if you can identify it correctly (don't mix it up with the orange berried native kumahou), you can kill it! Check out how here: <https://www.weedaction.org.nz/cotoneaster/>

Elaeagnus will produce berries later in the year, but until then, it can easily be out of sight, lurking amongst other trees and shrubs. Look for its long reaching tendrils which turn into woody "legs", typically covered in nasty spikes and often re-rooting and spreading outward from the main trunk. The leaves have a distinctive bronze colour on the underside. Previously planted as a hedge, this beast has the ability to completely overtake a forest canopy and collapse it.
